25 This suit was commenced on July 3, 1924. The plaintiff
26 thereafter filed an amended complaint to which amended complaint
27 the several defendants filed their answers and cross complaints.

28 The parties to said suit were represented by attorneys

3 Thomas F. Moran and Sardis Summerfield originally repre-
4 sented Minnie M. Powell, as the successor in interest of James
5 Powell, who was subsequently represented by George L. Sanford.

6 W. W. Watson represented Bertrand Salles, sued herein
7 as Mrs. Bertrand Salles. This defendant and his counsel were
8 represented at the hearings by George L. Sanford.

9 Arthur F. Lasher represented Joseph P. Perazzo, succes-
10 sor in interest to Perazzo Brothers. These interests were, dur-
11 ing the pendency of the suit, acquired by the Bank of Nevada
12 Savings and Trust Company and were represented by Thatcher and
13 Woodburn and William Forman.

14 George B. Thatcher and William Woodburn, with William
15 Forman as counsel, represented Sierra Pacific Power Company,
16 successor to Truckee River General Electric Company, Bank of
17 Nevada Savings and Trust Company, Antelope Valley Land and Cattle
18 Company, and originally represented Antelope Valley Mutual Water
19 Company, which was subsequently represented by Green and Lunsford.

20 This suit was referred to B. F. Curler, appointed by
21 the Court on March 12, 1928, as Special Master in Chancery, to
22 take testimony in the suit and report to the Court "as to conclu-
23 sions of fact and of law and as to the form and substance of the
24 decree to be entered." Testimony was thereafter taken by said
25 Special Master and documentary evidence received. Before the
26 completion of the taking of testimony said B. F. Curler resigned
27 and Robert M. Price was appointed by the Court Special Master in
28 his stead with like instructions and powers as those given to said
29 B. F. Curler. Upon the appointment and qualification of said
30 Robert M. Price as Special Master, further hearings were had, the
cause was argued by counsel for all of the parties to the suit

1 and on July 24, 1931, submitted for decision. The Special Master
2 thereupon prepared and submitted to the attorneys for the several
3 parties to the suit, a proposed report, findings of fact and con-
4 clusions of law and decree, for the purpose of enabling correct-
5 ions of descriptions and in other minor matters to be made. There-
6 after the cause was, at the request of the attorneys for the sev-
7 eral parties, reopened for the presentation of further evidence
8 respecting other rights than those which had been determined in
9 the proposed decree and further hearings were had and evidence,
10 oral and documentary, presented. Thereafter the cause was further
11 argued by counsel, corrections in and additions to the proposed
12 decree were made and the cause again submitted to the Special
13 Master. The Special Master thereupon made his report to the Court,
14 submitting proposed findings of fact, conclusions of law and de-
15 cree. Objections having been made thereto by several parties to
16 the suit, the Court ordered a hearing at Carson City, Nevada, on
17 May 22, 1933, at which hearing arguments were presented at length
18 by the attorneys representing the several parties to the suit and
19 the cause was submitted to the Court for decision. The Court, on
20 May 27, 1933, referred the matter to the Special Master to take
21 further testimony respecting claimed rights of certain parties.
22 Thereupon further hearings were had and redrafted findings of
23 fact, conclusions of law and decree were submitted to the Court.
24 The Court thereafter rendered an opinion upon the questions of
25 law involved in the suit and re-referred the matter to the Special
26 Master for redrafting of the findings of fact, conclusions of law
27 and decree. The Special Master, pursuant to the direction of the
28 Court, resubmitted to the Court and to the attorneys for the sev-
29 eral parties/redrafted proposed findings of fact, conclusions of
30 law and decree. Objections to the same were filed and argued

1 before the Court in San Francisco, California, and finally sub-
2 mitted on January 10, 1936. The Court, having considered the
3 arguments of counsel and the evidence and having made its findings
4 of fact and conclusions of law, orders, adjudges and decrees as
5 follows:

7 RIGETS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

8 I. The plaintiff, United States of America, is hereby
9 adjudged to be the owner of the several rights acquired by appro-
10 priation in and to the waters of Walker River for use upon Walker
11 River Indian Reservation in the State of Nevada as set forth in
12 the following tabulation, which shows in columns reading from left
13 to right the years in which the several rights of appropriation
14 accrued, the amounts of water expressed in cubic feet per second
15 at the point of diversion acquired in such years respectively,
16 and the number of acres irrigated under such appropriations.

25 II. The parties defendant to this suit, or their suc-
26 cessors in interest, hereinafter in this paragraph II. mentioned,
27 whose rights were adjudicated for them, or their predecessors in
28 interest, in the decree of this Court in the suit entitled,
29 "Pacific Livestock Company, a corporation, Plaintiff, vs. T. B.
30 Rickey, et al, Defendants" in Equity No. 731, are hereby severally

1 adjudged to be the owners of certain rights acquired by appro-
 2 priation in and to the waters of Walker River and/or its tribu-
 3 taries and are hereby decreed the rights as appropriators as set
 4 forth in the following tabulation, which gives in separate columns
 5 reading from left to right the name of the present owner of an
 6 existing right, the name of the stream from which the appropri-
 7 ation was made, the year when the right of appropriation accrued,
 8 the amount of water expressed in cubic feet per second to the use
 9 of which the owner is entitled at the point of diversion, the
 10 number of acres irrigated by such water and the description of
 11 the land to which the appropriated waters have been conducted or
 12 applied to a beneficial use. All of the land below described is
 13 situated in townships north and ranges east of Mount Diablo Base
 14 and Meridian and the designation "M. D. B. & M." is made a part
 15 of each description of land as fully as if specifically set forth.
 16 Where the number of acres described under the several priorities
 17 is in excess of the number of acres irrigated, it is understood
 18 that the number of acres irrigated are included in the specific
 19 description of the land and that the land to be irrigated from
 20 the several priorities is the number of acres specifically set
 21 forth under "No. of acres irrigated".



All of the lands hereinabove described are situated in townships north and ranges east of Mount Diablo Base and Meridian and the designation "M. D. B. & M." is hereby made a part of each description of land as fully as if specifically set forth.

All such applications and permits are subject to vested prior rights and to final action by the State Engineer upon such applications.

X. The parties above named are hereby adjudged to be the owners of the use of the several amounts of water from the several streams as above set forth and are entitled to divert and use such waters of Walker River and/or its tributaries as the case may be, for the beneficial purposes specified, subject to and in accord with the priorities above set forth. Wherever two or more persons are given a priority as of the same year and from

1 the same stream, such priorities shall be deemed to be identical
2 in point of time and equal in point of right with due regard to
3 the amount hereby allowed to each. Any of the said parties shall
4 be entitled to change the manner, means, place or purpose of use
5 or the point of diversion of the said waters or any thereof in
6 the manner provided by law, so far as they may do so without
7 injury to the rights of other parties hereto, as the same are
8 fixed hereby.

9
10 XI. Each and every party to this suit and their and
11 each of their servants, agents and attorneys and all persons
12 claiming by, through or under them, and their successors and
13 assigns in and to the water rights and lands herein described,
14 be and each of them hereby is forever enjoined and restrained from
15 claiming any rights in or to the waters of Walker River and/or
16 its branches and/or its tributaries, except the rights set up and
17 specified in this decree and each of the said parties is hereby
18 enjoined and restrained from taking, diverting or interfering in
19 any way with the waters of the said Walker River or its branches
20 or tributaries so as to in any way or manner interfere with the
21 diversion, enjoyment and use of the waters of any of the other
22 parties to this suit as set forth in this decree, having due re-
23 gard to the relative rights and priorities herein set forth; and
24 each of the said parties is hereby enjoined and restrained from
25 ever taking, diverting, carrying away, or otherwise using or claim-
26 ing any of the water so allotted to them in any manner or at any
27 time so as to in any way interfere with the prior rights of other
28 parties to this suit as the same are herein set forth, or until
29 such parties having prior rights as herein specified have received
30 upon their several lands the waters so adjudicated to them.

1 XII. This decree shall be deemed to determine all of
2 the rights of the parties to this suit and their successors in
3 interest in and to the waters of Walker River and its tributaries,
4 except the undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District
5 under its applications to the State Water Commission of the State
6 of California and the undetermined rights of the applicants for
7 permits from the State Engineer of the State of Nevada hereinabove
8 specified, and it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that
9 none of the parties to this suit has any right, title, interest
10 or estate in or to the waters of said Walker River, its branches
11 or its tributaries other than as above set forth, excepting the
12 undetermined rights of Walker River Irrigation District and the
13 several applicants for permits from the State Engineer of the
14 State of Nevada. Nothing herein shall prejudice the rights of
15 any of the parties defendant hereto under any transfer or legal
16 succession in interest since the commencement of this suit to any
17 of the rights hereby adjudicated to the several parties defend-
18 ant.

19
20 XIII. Nothing herein shall affect the right of any of
21 the parties hereto to rotate the use of water, or to combine or
22 exchange the use thereof, so far as they may do so without in-
23 juriouly affecting the rights of any of the other parties here-
24 to, and the Water Master, hereinafter mentioned, may permit the
25 said parties to rotate the use of said water or to combine or ex-
26 change the use thereof, having due regard to the priorities herein
27 fixed, so far as the same may be done without injuriouly affect-
28 ing the rights of the other parties to this suit.

29
30 XIV. The Court retains jurisdiction of this cause for

1 the purpose of changing the duty of water or for correcting or
2 modifying this decree; also for regulatory purposes, including
3 a change of the place of use of any water user, but no water
4 shall be sold or delivered outside of the basin of the Walker
5 River except that appurtenant to the lands of Mrs. J. A. Conway
6 and R. P. Conway referred to in the foregoing tabulation.

7 The Court shall hereafter make such regulations as to
8 notice and form or substance of any applications for change or
9 modification of this decree, or for change of place or manner of
10 use of water as it may deem necessary.

11 The owner of each ditch or canal herein authorized to
12 divert water from the Walker River or its tributaries shall at
13 his or its own expense install and at all times maintain at or
14 near the intake of such ditch or canal, a reliable, sufficient
15 and easily operated regulating headgate and a locking measuring
16 box, flume or other device to be approved by the Water Master,
17 whereby the water diverted into such ditch or canal may be regu-
18 lated and correctly measured. Upon failure of any owner of such
19 ditch or canal to install such regulating, locking and measuring
20 device on or before the first day of May, 1937, or at such earl-
21 ier date as may be fixed or demanded by the Water Master, upon
22 ten days' notice, or to maintain such regulating, locking or
23 measuring device, the Water Master shall cut off the water from
24 such ditch or canal until the same shall be so installed and
25 maintained.

26
27 XV. The Court, whenever it shall deem it necessary,
28 shall appoint a Water Master, who shall be charged with the duty
29 of apportioning and distributing the waters of the Walker River,
30 its forks and tributaries in the State of Nevada and in the State

1 of California, including water for storage and stored water, in
2 accordance with the provisions of this decree. / The said Water
3 Master shall serve until the further order of this Court and may
4 be removed by the Court at any time. The Water Master shall have
5 authority to appoint deputies to assist him. Upon
6 application to the Court he may employ such additional assistants
7 as the circumstances may require. The said Water Master shall re-
8 ceive an annual salary of \$, payable in monthly in-
9 stallments of \$. The compensation of his assist-
10 ants shall be fixed by the Court from time to time. The said
11 Water Master also shall be authorized to rent, furnish and main-
12 tain an office for his use and to incur necessary expenses for
13 transportation of himself and his assistants and for other proper
14 purposes, all of which shall be reported to and be approved by the
15 Court twice yearly, that is to say, on the first day of May and
16 the first day of November in each year.

17 The compensation of the Water Master and his assistants
18 and all expenses connected with his employment shall be appor-
19 tioned among the several parties hereto, both in the State of
20 Nevada and in the State of California, according to the acreage
21 of the lands irrigated under this decree, including stored water
22 and the Court reserves jurisdiction to hereafter enter judgment
23 for any unpaid portion of said expenses and to make and enforce
24 such regulations for the collection of said money as may be neces-
25 sary and proper.

26 The said Water Master, with the approval of the Court,
27 may make such rules as may be necessary and proper for the en-
28 forcement of this decree and for the carrying out of its purposes
29 and objects and the proper apportionment and distribution, includ-
30 ing rotation of the use of water where necessary, of the waters

1 of said Walker River among and to the persons entitled thereto,
2 including water for storage and stored water.

3
4 XVI. The irrigation season along the Walker River,
5 its branches and its tributaries, extends from the first day of
6 March to the thirtieth day of September of each year, except that
7 in Bridgeport Valley on the East Walker River and at all points
8 above Coleville Gauging Station on the West Walker River the
9 irrigating season covers the period from March first to September
10 fifteenth of each year.

11
12 XVII. Each of the parties to this suit shall severally
13 pay their costs therein expended.

14
15 XVIII. The Special Masters, B. F. Curler and Robert M.
16 Price, heretofore appointed by the Court "to take the evidence
17 and testimony herein, and to report the same to the Court with
18 his recommendations for the advice of the Court as to conclusions
19 of fact and of law, and as to the form and substance of the de-
20 cree to be entered" shall be paid for their several services by
21 the United States of America, such sums respectively as the Court
22 shall hereafter order.
