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Pursuant to the Interim Order dated July 17, 2012 and the Amended Notice of Hearing dated August 10, 2012, the Walker River Irrigation District (the "District"), Lyon County and the Bowman Protestants (collectively, the "Joint Protestants") hereby submit their Witnesses, Outline of Testimony, and Exhibit List. A copy of each Exhibit on the Exhibit List is also being provided under separate cover in hard copy or by computer compact disk.

I. WITNESSES AND OUTLINE OF TESTIMONY.

A. Kenneth C. Spooner

The Joint Protestants will call Kenneth C. Spooner. Mr. Spooner will testify concerning his background and his employment as General Manager of the Walker River Irrigation District. Mr. Spooner will provide general information on the relevant geography of the Walker River Basin and the area and facilities involved with Change Application No. 80700. His testimony will include a description and explanation of selected features of the Walker River Basin in California and Nevada, including, but not limited to, the headwaters of the West Fork of the Walker River through Antelope Valley, Topaz Lake, Smith Valley, and into Mason Valley; the headwaters of the East Fork of the Walker River in Bridgeport Valley, including Bridgeport Reservoir, the East Walker area, and into Mason Valley; and the Main Walker River in Mason Valley to the Schurz Valley, and into Walker Lake. Mr. Spooner will also provide background testimony concerning the organization of the District, and the ownership of ditches and ditch companies within the boundaries of the District. Mr. Spooner will testify about water rights appurtenant to lands within the District. He will also testify to water rights held by the District.

Mr. Spooner will testify concerning acquisitions of land and/or water rights made to date by the Applicant, National Fish and Wildlife Foundation ("NFWF") within the boundaries of the District. He will testify as to the existing point of diversion, place and manner of use of such acquired water rights. He will also provide testimony concerning Water Rights Assessment Agreements between NFWF and the District concerning the payment of District assessments

associated with acquired water rights and Deeds of Trust which secure NFWF's obligations under the Water Rights Assessment Agreements.

B. Lee G. Bergfeld

The Joint Protestants will call Lee G. Bergfeld, P.E., of MBK Engineers of Sacramento, California. Mr. Bergfeld will testify as an expert witness. Mr. Bergfeld will testify concerning his educational background and employment history since college. He will testify concerning the consumptive use of applied water for alfalfa in Mason Valley. He will testify concerning the data, methods and assumptions he used to calculate the consumptive use of applied water. He

will testify that it is his opinion that the annual consumptive use of applied water for alfalfa in Mason Valley is 3.0 acre feet per acre. His testimony will be based upon and consistent with information included in his written and signed report dated February 14, 2013. Mr. Bergfeld will also compare and contrast his conclusions to the relevant conclusions in the January, 2010 report published by the Nevada Division of Water Resources entitled "Evapotranspiration and Net Irrigation Water Requirements for Nevada," and to the relevant conclusions made in other published reports.

Mr. Bergfeld will sponsor the following exhibits:

C. Marc Van Camp

The Joint Protestants will call Marc Van Camp, P.E., of MBK Engineers of Sacramento, California. Mr. Van Camp will testify as an expert witness. Mr. Van Camp will testify concerning his educational background, employment history since college, and his experience. He will testify concerning background information relevant to Application No. 80700, including, but not limited to, the Walker River Decree and the manner in which the Walker River Decree is administered. He will provide information concerning water rights within the Walker River Basin, including, but not limited to, those appurtenant to lands within the District. He will testify about the specific water rights which are the subject of Application No. 80700, their existing point of diversion, and their existing place of use. Mr. Van Camp will also testify about the recognized senior water right and recognized junior water rights which are the subject of Application No. 80700. He will also testify about recognized junior water rights which are

upstream of the existing point of diversion of those same water rights. He will further testify about water rights claimed to exist for the Walker River Indian Reservation downstream of the existing point of diversion of the water rights which are the subject of the Application No. 80700. Mr. Van Camp will also testify concerning an ongoing dispute concerning the proper place of measurement for the 26.25 cfs water right with an 1859 priority date recognized in the Walker River Decree for the Walker River Indian Reservation.

Mr. Van Camp will provide information on the hydrologic variability of the Walker River and how that variability affects water available to satisfy water rights recognized by the Walker River Decree. Specifically, he will provide sample years showing periods of water availability, based on Water Master Records to the water rights which are the subject of Application No. 80700. He will identify the key points of the Walker River Decree and related Rules and Regulations relative to the determination of water availability.

It is Mr. Van Camp's opinion that in order to avoid a conflict with existing rights as required by Nevada law, to avoid injury to the water rights of other parties as required by the Walker River Decree, and to avoid similar conflict with and injury to water rights claimed to exist, but which are not yet recognized, the Nevada State Engineer must limit the quantity of water which may be changed from irrigation to instream flow under each water right associated with Application No. 80700 to the flow rate associated with the consumptive use portion of the water right being changed up to a quantity not to exceed 3.0 acre feet per acre per irrigation season, and must limit the exercise of that changed water right to times when the Water Master determines that both the consumptive and non-consumptive use portions of each such water right are simultaneously available at the existing point of diversion (the point of non-diversion). He will further testify that the changed water right must remain subject to the regulation and continuing jurisdiction of the Water Master for all purposes under the Walker River Decree. His

testimony will be based upon and consistent with information included in his written and signed report dated February 15, 2013.

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The Joint Protestants will call Jim Snyder, a farmer and rancher within the District. Mr. Snyder will testify concerning his background and his family's farming and ranching history within the District. Through his family's farming and ranching operation, Mr. Snyder is familiar with several ditches and ditch companies, including the Campbell Canal Company, the Fox Ditch Company, the Greenwood Mutual Ditch Company, the G&H Mutual Ditch Company, the New Hall Daniel Ditch Company, the Mickey Mutual Ditch Company, and the Spragg-Woodcock Mutual Ditch Company.

Mr. Snyder will testify concerning how expenses associated with the operation and maintenance of private ditches within the District are assessed and collected. He will also testify concerning remedies available to assist owners of private ditches in the collection of assessments. In connection with changes to water rights which permanently change the point of diversion of water rights out of ditches within the District, Mr. Snyder will explain why the State Engineer should condition the exercise of such changed water rights to require continued payment of ditch and ditch company assessments associated with the ditch from which the water rights are being changed in order to avoid burdening the remaining users on any such ditch with an ever increasing proportionate share of costs and expenses associated with its operation and maintenance.

E. Peter Fenili

The Joint Protestants will call Peter Fenili, a fourth generation rancher and farmer whose land is located in Smith Valley, Nevada, who grows alfalfa, grass hay and grain forages. He owns 251 acres in two separate parcels of land, which is "new land" within the District boundaries and receives water from the Saroni Canal and the West Walker Ditch Company. Mr. Fenili will testify concerning the effects of the Change of Place and Manner of Use Application No. 80700, and the significant impact upon farmers and ranchers who receive only stored water from the District. Mr. Fenili will testify as to how stored water is administered, and why the

removal of Decree water from the existing irrigation system will have adverse effects on the Walker River Irrigation District's ability to administer and deliver stored water.

F. Richard Nuti

The Joint Protestants will call Richard Nuti, a Smith Valley farmer of alfalfa, grass hay and small grain, and a rancher within the boundaries of the Walker River Irrigation District. Mr. Nuti operates under the family corporation of Six-N-Ranch. Mr. Nuti has some land which has solely stored water for irrigation, and some which depends upon supplemental groundwater. Mr. Nuti will testify that he is a third generation farmer who would hope to be able to pass his interest in "new lands" and his stored water within the Walker River Irrigation District to the fourth and fifth generations of his family. Mr. Nuti will testify that if this change application (and others to follow) is allowed to remove water from the irrigation uses, and allow it to remain in stream, "new land" water right holders will be more detrimentally impacted as they only have stored water to irrigate their crops.

G. Gary Garms

The Joint Protestants will call Gary Garms, a Smith Valley farmer whose land has been farmed by members of his family since the 1930s. The fourth generation of his family is now involved in farming. Mr. Garms is expected to testify as to the disproportionate effect the change before the State Engineer will be for those who farm "new lands" and which receive stored water from the Walker River Irrigation District. Mr. Garms is also expected to testify to the economic impacts the loss of the quantity of stored water capable of being delivered in any irrigation season means to farmers and ranchers whose lands are irrigated utilizing stored water.
