The word Ibapah means gray water. The word Goshute means gray Ute, which the new settlers thought we were, Ute's. Which we aren't. The gray mud that we found in the Deep Creek, we the Goshute's rub on ourselves for a cure of many ailments. The water which flows within each perennial stream we use for our religious ceremonies, and our spirit lies deep in each turbitarie. Our name comes from the water that flowsthroughout the valley. So, if the water is drained from the valley, so would our name Gushute. Culture, language, and our name Goshute Goshute are for a way too. As a rancher I depend on the water. The impact on our Tribes socio-economic would be severe.
