Further, the families and small businesses of Las Vegas, recovering from a brutal recession, cannot afford the huge price tag for this project.

Having lived in both northern and southern Nevada, I strongly urge that the proposed pipeline project be rejected. There are still many water saving initiatives that can be implemented in southern Nevada before we contemplate the importation of water from northern Nevada.

I would also like to reference the Owens Valley situation where Los Angeles Power and Light obtained water rights that were ulimately overturned due to depletion of ground water in the Owens Valley. I do not think we need to go through a similiar legal battle in the years to come in Nevada. Reasonalbe growth limits and good water conservation efforts should be our first line of attack.
