Further, the families and small businesses of Las Vegas, recovering from a brutal recession, cannot afford the huge price tag for this

In the 1990s, whenever I traveled to Las Vegas from my homes first in Tonopah and then in Ely, I felt great dismay and anger to see housing developments like Desert Shores and The Lakes and casinos like The Mirage, Treasure Island, The Bellagio, and The Venetian create lakes and ponds using municipal water to fill and maintain them.
